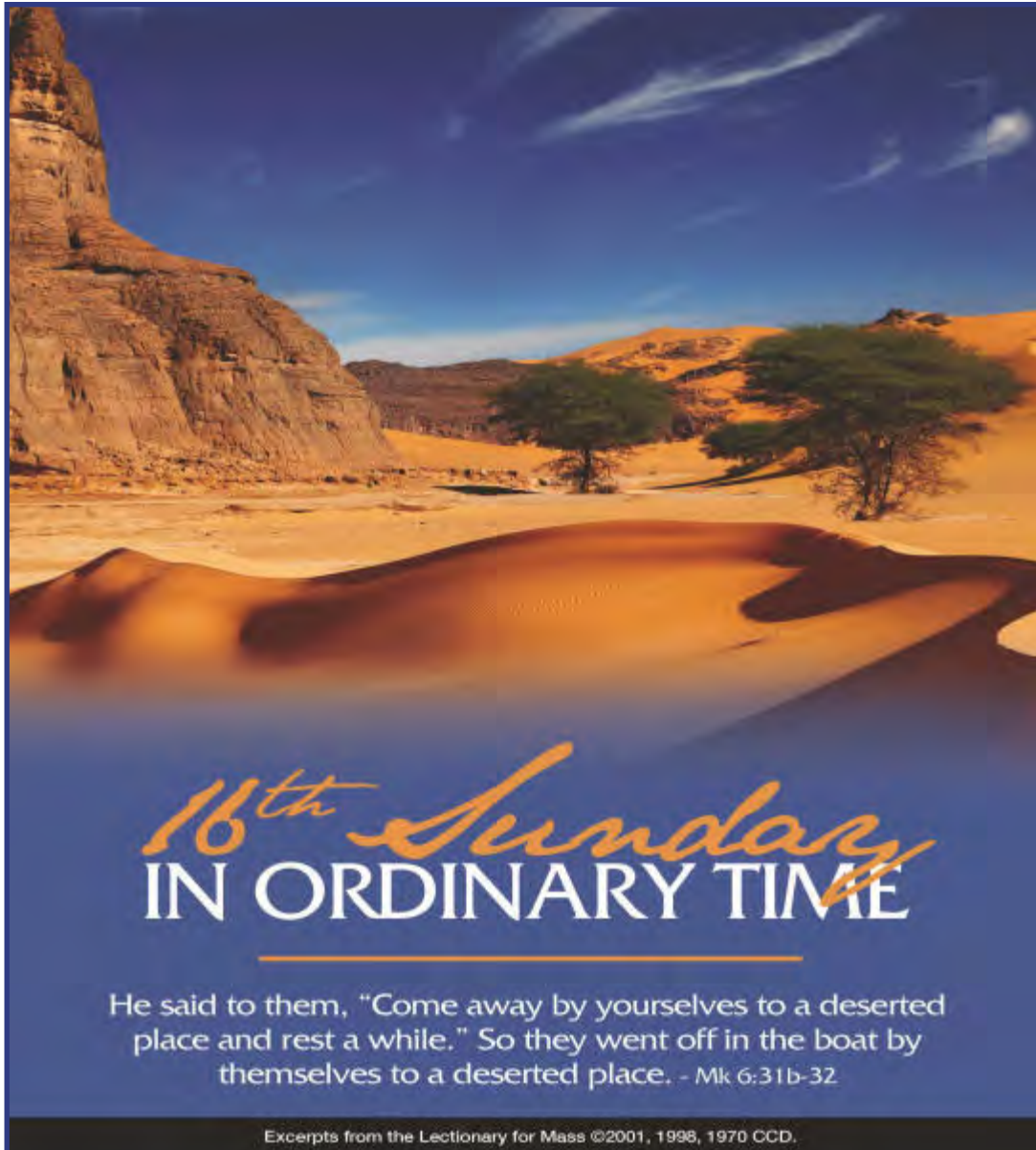

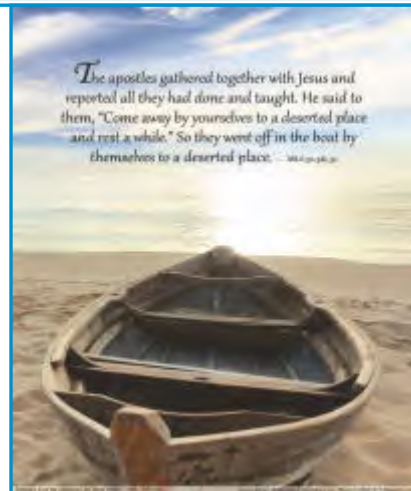

Gospel Meditation – Encourage Deeper Understanding Of Scripture – Sixteenth Sunday In Ordinary Time



"Now what?" It's a difficult thing to hear, isn't it? The train comes late, a child unexpectedly cries, and the latest public policy debate flares up in the news. Life throws us curveballs, and we have no choice but to adapt. Jesus and the Apostles find themselves in that exact situation in today's Gospel.

The Apostles have returned from their two-by-two missionary journey. As Jesus hears all of their stories, He knows they need time to recover and refresh. *"Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while."* Their wilderness retreat is short-lived, however, as eager

crowds discover their location. Jesus is well aware of the needs of His disciples. Still, as He looks out at the crowd, *"His heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd."* The rest break is over. *"He began to teach them many things."*

For those of us who have experienced a taste of much-needed relaxation, only to have it taken away abruptly, perhaps we surmise what the Apostles might have been feeling in that moment. But Jesus isn't being inconsiderate of the Apostles' needs. He offers them – and us – a lived lesson. St. John Paul II wrote, *"The whole of Christ's life was a continual teaching: His silences, His miracles, His gestures, His prayer, His love for people, His special affection for the little and the poor, His acceptance of the total sacrifice on the Cross for the redemption of the world."* (On Catechesis in Our Time, 9). In Jesus' choice to teach, we see all of these things: sacrificial love, concern for the marginalized, and priority of people's needs over personal preference. These aren't abstract ideals. They are lived realities as we strive to live and love like Jesus. *When a new obstacle confronts you in your life, how do you respond?*

Everyday Stewardship

My daughter can easily become overwhelmed by having so much to do. She recently graduated from high school, and many times during those four years, she found herself going crazy from being involved in so many things. Sports, drama, youth group, homework, friends, and more, all demanded a slice of her attention. Sometimes the slice of time that remained wasn't much, and one does have to sleep!

A good everyday steward can get caught up in doing so much, and giving so much that he or she loses sight of the fact that you cannot give what you do not have. If you have no time left, you cannot give that. If you have no energy left, you cannot give that. Finally, if you find yourself agitated and overwhelmed, you cannot give that which others benefit from the most: YOU!

Even when we plant seeds in a garden after tilling and watering the soil, we must rest and wait for there to be growth. If we do not take time to rest and recharge, we are not allowing time for God's grace to bring forth new life in us. We fear that things will suffer without us, but the truth is that no one is benefiting from our fatigue. We can think we are giving, but really we are empty. Take some time and rest in your God. Retreat and recharge. Then you will be able to share once again.

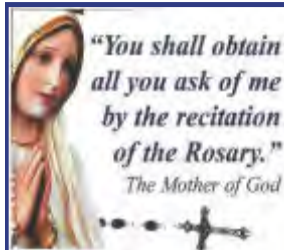

We require that your family be registered participating parishioners at Our Lady of Humility Parish for a minimum of one year prior to requesting a date for the Quinceanera celebration. Please note, registration for Our Lady of Humility School or Religious Education Classes, does not register you as a parishioner. The Parish has a separate form available online, at the entries of the Church, or in the Parish Office. A participating parishioner receives Parish donation envelopes, and regularly attends Mass here at Our Lady of Humility Parish.

Registered parishioners should contact the Rectory a minimum of 9 months in advance to schedule the Quinceanera, as Preparation Classes must be scheduled prior to the celebration.

We cannot guarantee specific dates will be available, so it is best to register early, prior to reserving any reception facilities.

 - “How do I become Catholic?”

What Is RCIA?

- ◆ RCIA is an acronym for **R**ite of **C**hristian **I**nitiation for **A**dults.
 - In the very earliest days of the Church, adults took instruction in the Christian Faith and learned its’ ways. The RCIA is simply the process by which **adults** today learn about the Church, its’ practices, and prayer life, and are welcomed into the Catholic Church Faith Community.

You Are Invited:

- ◆ RCIA is intended for:
 - 1) Those who are not Baptized, and may wish to be Baptized into Christ within the Catholic Community;
 - 2) Those that are already part of Christ’s Church through Baptism in another Faith Community, but who may wish to profess Faith within the Catholic Church; and
 - 3) Those who are Baptized Catholic, but have not celebrated the Sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Eucharist.

When Are The Sessions?

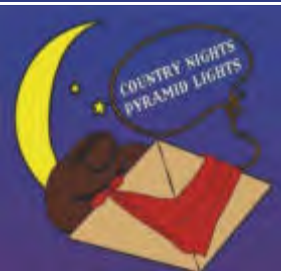

Ask A Priest

Q: *I recently read a quote by Pope Benedict XVI about applause at Mass, and it seemed to suggest that doing so was regarded negatively. I've only ever known applause to be something positive. Can you explain this further?*

A: I believe that the quote you are referring to is from Pope Benedict's great work, *The Spirit of the Liturgy*. The book was published in 2000, when then Cardinal Josef Ratzinger was the Prefect of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith. Here is the quote in its' entirety:

"Wherever applause breaks out in the Liturgy because of some human achievement, it is a sure sign that the Essence of Liturgy has totally disappeared and been replaced by a kind of religious entertainment." (Spirit of the Liturgy, p. 198).

To understand Benedict's concern, we first need to understand what is meant by the 'Essence of the Liturgy.' *Liturgy* is derived from the Greek words *leito* (the public) and *ergos* (to work, to press on, to compel). Literally speaking, the Liturgy is the 'work of the people.'

Perhaps you have heard this joke before: there are only two things in life that are necessary; death and taxes! Well, that is not entirely true. As humans created in the image and likeness of God, we are also **required** to give God the worship and praise He is due. This is why we pray, offer devotions, and make sacrifices; they are ways to give God fitting worship and praise. Of course, there is another action that we can do as people, one that is considered the **perfect way** to offer praise to God. When we gather on Sunday for the celebration of the Mass, when we take part in the **Sacred Liturgy**... it is our work, our solemn responsibility as the people of God!

Read what the Second Vatican Council has to say about the Liturgy:

Rightly, then, the Liturgy is considered as an exercise of the priestly office of Jesus Christ. In the Liturgy, the sanctification of the man is signified by signs perceptible to the senses, and is effected in a way which corresponds with each of these signs; in the Liturgy the whole public worship is performed by the Mystical Body of Jesus Christ, that is, by the Head and His members.

From this it follows that every liturgical celebration, because it is an action of Christ the priest, and of His Body which is the Church, is a sacred action surpassing all others; no other action of the Church can equal its' efficacy by the same title, and to the same degree (*Sacrosanctum Concilium*, #7).

Isn't that just beautiful? When we gather for worship at Mass, it is not Father So-and-so that is leading our worship... it is actually **Jesus Christ Himself**, working through the Holy Orders of the priest! Christ uses physical signs (like water, wine, bread), and with them, brings about the sanctification of the entire world! But it is not just Christ doing the work. As baptized members of the Church, we are all part of the Mystical Body of Christ. As such, the celebration of the Mass truly is **Liturgy**, because it is the work of **all** the people of God.

Which brings us back to Ratzinger's quote. He does not want us to applaud a strictly *human* achievement. The Liturgy must be **totally** about God. Every action we do, when we sing or play an instrument, when we participate as a Lector or Altar Server, when we respond to the prayers, when we pay attention to the homily, when we put our donation in the collection basket, when we help distribute communion... these actions are for the praise and greater glory of our God. When I prepare for and deliver a good homily, when I write a good article for the bulletin... these actions are not performed so that people will like me or hold me in high esteem. They are done so that God can be better understood by the people, so that all of us are drawn deeper into a relationship with our loving God.

So, if you feel the urge to applaud someone at Mass, please pause for a moment and ask yourself, "*why?*". *Is it because you are impressed by the talent that he is displaying on the violin? Is it because she hit every note with perfect pitch and clarity? Is it because his homily was entertaining?* If these are our motivations, then the **Essence** of the Liturgy is lost; we are more concerned about our own entertainment than we are for the greater glory of God. Mass is not supposed to be boring or irrelevant, but it is not supposed to be pure entertainment, either. So, during Mass, let's actively participate in the praise of God, and save our applause for something else.

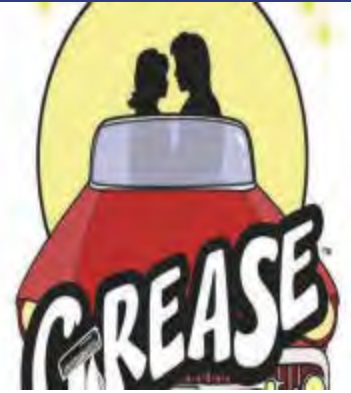

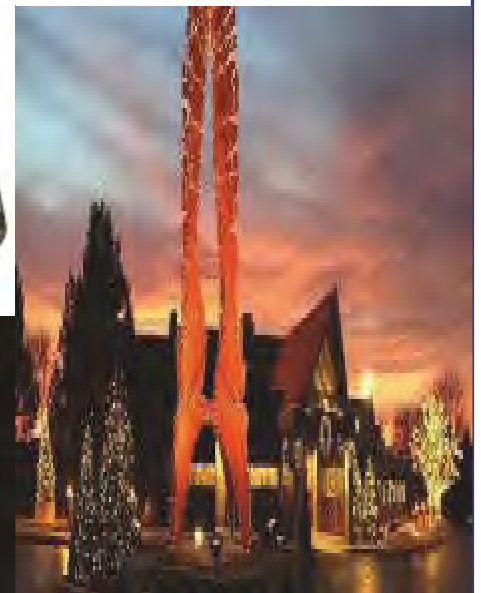
1. Saturday – September 8, 2018 – "Grease"
