## Quinceanera Requirements

We have many requests for Quinceaneras, and want to ensure everyone is aware of the requirements for scheduling this celebration. We offer a Quinceanera Service performed by a Deacon.

We require that your family be registered participating parishioners at Our Lady of Humility Parish for a minimum of one year prior to requesting a date for the Quinceanera celebration. Please note, registration for Our Lady of Humility School or Religious Education Classes, does not register you as a parishioner. The Parish has a separate form available online, at the entries of the Church, or in the Parish Office. A participating parishioner receives Parish donation envelopes, and regularly attends Mass here at Our Lady of Humility Parish.

Registered parishioners should contact the Rectory a minimum of 9 months in advance to schedule the Quinceanera, as Preparation Classes must be scheduled prior to the celebration.

We cannot guarantee specific dates will be available, so it is best to register early, prior to reserving any reception facilities.

## Eucharistic Adoration — A Changed Person

Jesus is the living word, and a finer tutor could not be imagined, as the two men who walked the Road to Emmaus with Him testified.

Praying the Rosary, meditating, or simply resting in the quiet of His presence, Eucharistic Adoration enhances them all. Jesus also is there to hear your petitions, but we should guard against making it all about ourselves. Keep the focus on Him, and you can't go wrong.

Father Hardon saw this practice as the centerpiece of devotion, saying that we *"should build the whole edifice of our spiritual life around adoration."*

Of course, one does not need to be engaged in sacramental adoration to have access to Jesus. He is always available to those who come to Him in faith. But the Church teaches that the manifestation of Jesus in the Eucharist is *"unique"* and *"in the fullest sense,"* and therefore, worthy of special devotion (CCC, No. 1374).

Just as His disciples were transformed by being in Jesus' presence, it's impossible to spend an hour with Him in Eucharistic Adoration, and leave the same person we were when we walked in. So consider giving it a try.

I will give Blessed Mother Teresa of Kolkata, a daily recipient of the Eucharist, the final word:

*"Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is the best time you will spend on earth."* —F. Douglas Kneibert writes from Missouri.

Do something special this Summer, please consider coming to Eucharistic Adoration on Thursdays at 1PM, where you will have an opportunity to spend time with the Lord Jesus, in the Blessed Sacrament each week where we can ASK HIM anything. ## Ask A Priest

Ask a Priest

**Q:** *I have a question about the Church teaching regarding the perpetual virginity of Mary. It strikes me as troublesome from the standpoint that the marriage of the Holy Family would not be consummated, and therefore, subject to be annulled by the Church. Also, Matthew 1:25, would be open to the interpretation that Joseph and Mary did have marital relations, but only after the birth of Jesus, thereby preserving the teaching that Jesus was conceived by Mary, as a virgin, through the power of the Holy Spirit. Is it possible that the Church's teaching on Mary's perpetual virginity refers to her totally sinless life? To me, a person who is born without original sin, and lives their entire life without committing a sin, is far more remarkable than a person who lives a celibate life even though she is married.*

\*\*\*\*\*

**A:** This question points out several legitimate concerns for those who wish to adhere to Church teachings, but who are familiar with these 'problematic' texts. Throughout the past few centuries, people have wrestled with this issue, trying to bring about reconciliation through compromise. Not sure how well my words will help in this confusion, but I'll give it a shot!

*Aeiparthenos*, the 'Ever-virginity' of Mary, is a belief that has been held by Catholics since the 2nd century, most recently re-affirmed by the Second Vatican Council (LG, #57). It is a doctrine that is to be held *de fide* (as an essential part of the faith). As a result, we need to tread **VERY** carefully from here on out; any alternate conclusion would be considered heresy!

Let's look first at Matthew 1:25; "And (Joseph) had no relations with (Mary) until she bore a son." Two things to consider. First, the Greek word we translate as **until** only explains what happened previously; it **does not signify a change in condition**. Look, for example, at 1 Corinthians 15:25; "For He must reign **until** He has put all His enemies under His feet." How about 1 Timothy 6:14; "That you keep the commandment without stain or reproach **until** the appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ." The language is ambiguous, but it does not contradict the doctrine of *Aeiparthenos*.

The second point for our consideration is that in the genealogy of Matthew's Gospel, the protagonist is **Joseph**, not Mary! The Angel communicates with Joseph, it is Joseph who gives Jesus His name. Matthew 1:25 is not about the *Aeiparthenos*, it is about the humility and righteousness of Joseph.

Another 'troublesome' passage is Matthew 12:46-50, which talks about Jesus' **brothers**. *If Mary is Aeiparthenos, how is it that Jesus has brothers?* *Adelphoi*, the Greek word in question, has a wide range of usage. While it does mean a person who has the same mom and dad as me, it can also mean a person who grew up in the same town as me, and every relationship in-between! So again, the text is ambiguous, but it's not faith-altering.

*And how about the final part of the question; since the marriage of Mary and Joseph was never consummated, it would not even be recognized in the Catholic Church?* Ultimately, **a vocation is the particular way in which God calls us to love others**. For the vast majority of people, this is lived out in the Sacrament of Marriage. For some, this way of love is demonstrated in the celibate state; as a priest, religious, or single person. To say that one vocation is 'better' or 'holier' than the other, however, is ludicrous. We are each called to holiness in our own state in life.

Mary's perpetual virginity is about her vocation; her particular way of answering God's call to love. One of the great titles for the Blessed Mother is **the Ark of the Covenant**. As the Ark of the Covenant, Mary's body is a sacred temple, totally consecrated to God. Her role was to bring forth the Savior of the world; to give God His human nature. It is for this reason that God preserves her from original sin (Immaculate Conception); she is a spotless vessel of the Lord. It is for this same reason that Mary maintained her virginity before the birth of Christ; God is to enter the world through the spotless vessel. And it is for this reason that Mary remains a virgin **after** Christ's birth as well; her body is **still** a sacred vessel, dedicated entirely to God.

Mary's perpetual virginity is intrinsically linked to her sinless life, but one does not cause the other. Rather, both qualities demonstrate to us her single-mindedness of vocation. She is the Ark of the Covenant, the Temple of Christ. This doctrine of our faith is a fabulous mystery; one that we should embrace rather than try to explain away.

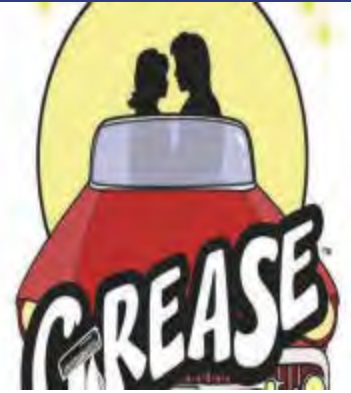
