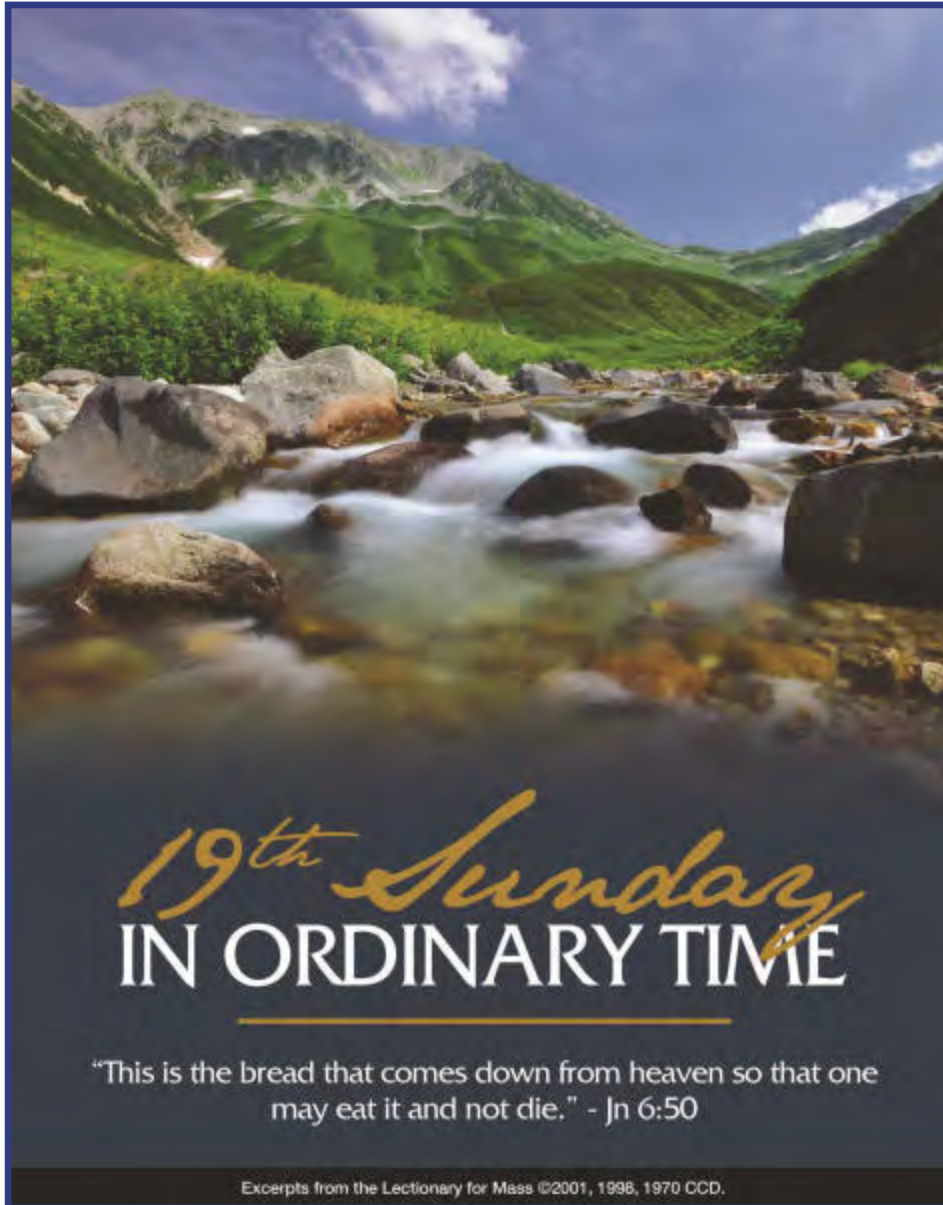

A Note From The Pastor...



I wanted to inform you of an ongoing Novena recommended by the United States Council of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). Last month, Cardinal Timothy Dolan, Archbishop of New York and Chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities, issued a statement inviting all people of good will to join in a prayer campaign that the change in the U.S. Supreme Court will move our nation closer to the day when every human being is protected in law and welcomed in life.



In the Cardinal's words, *"As soon as Supreme Court Justice Anthony Kennedy announced his retirement, pro-abortion groups began lobbying the U.S. Senate to reject any nominee who does not promise to endorse Roe v. Wade. While the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops does not support or oppose the confirmation of any presidential nominee, we can and should raise grave concerns about a confirmation process which is being grossly distorted by efforts to subject judicial nominees to a litmus test of support for Roe v. Wade. And we must pray.*

Each Friday, from August 3rd – September 28th, 2018, I urge all people of good will to join me in prayer that this change in the U.S. Supreme Court will move our nation closer to the day when every human being is protected in law, and welcomed in life. The USCCB Call to Prayer Network will share prayers and educational resources, and an invitation to fast on Fridays for this intention. May Our Lady of Guadalupe intercede for the healing of our nation, and our people from decades of abortion on demand." Please consider offering prayers and sacrifices on the Fridays leading up to September 28th.

We have a need for more volunteers to serve as Ministers of Care (MOC). MOCs visit and bring the Eucharist to Catholics in a variety of settings such as hospitals, retirement communities, and the homebound. Without MOCs, the faithful who are unable to attend Mass would be deprived of the infinite value of the Eucharist. Please consider praying about whether or not God is calling you to serve Him and the faithful in this way. Training would be provided. Please see next week's bulletin for more information.

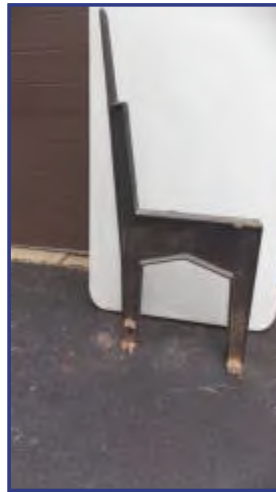

We will all sit together in reserved pews in the front of Church. At the proper time, we will be invited to stand and simultaneously recite the Morning Glory Consecration Prayer:



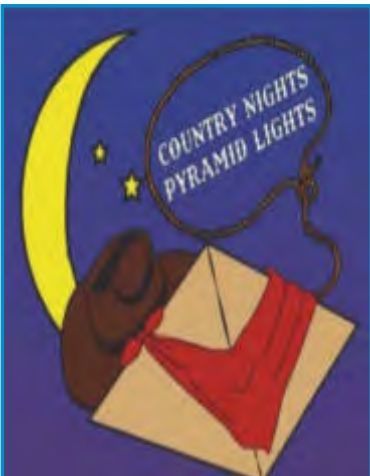

Letter From Fr. Mike

Dear Friends in Christ,

This past year has been a very interesting period of my life, to say the least! When I requested to serve as a dual Associate at St. Patrick and Our Lady of Humility, I had no idea what to expect. Obviously, I knew there was to be a lot of juggling between the parishes, running back and forth to various obligations, but I did not anticipate the level of difficulty entailed in this assignment. Our Lord Jesus Christ warned us of this in the Gospel, *“no one can serve two masters”* (Matthew 6:24). After this past year, I have a much greater appreciation for these words!

Now, this letter is not intended to be a plea of *‘let’s feel sorry for Father Mike.’* It is more of a personal realization that I cannot be in two places at the same time. I did the best that I could with my limited resources of time and energy, and I hope that I had a positive influence on your spiritual journey. But I just could never get comfortable with the dual parish assignment; all too often, I felt like a supply priest coming in to help out on the weekend. For my own spiritual well-being, I need to be giving 100% at one assignment.

At the same time, however, my prayer life over this past year has helped me recognize an ongoing spiritual itch that I have been trying to ignore, one for which I have finally worked up the courage to scratch. Through the help of trusted friends, colleagues, and spiritual directors, I have discerned an authentic vocation to the religious life; namely, to the Order of St. Benedict. Recently, I discovered the Monks at St. Leo Abbey in central Florida. Over the course of several weeks of retreat, I have found myself drawn into their life of prayer and work, their humility and poverty... I truly feel like I am home when I am there!

And so I write to you today with a sense of peace and serenity, as well as with a joy-filled excitement for my future endeavors, sensitive as well to your feelings of sadness at my departure. The Abbot of St. Leo has given me permission to start the application process for admission, and Cardinal Cupich has expressed a willingness to let me explore this vocation. As of this writing, I do not have a start date, but I am hoping that it is sooner rather than later.

In the interim, as I wait for my acceptance into the community, I will be working exclusively at Our Lady of Humility. This will give me the opportunity, however brief it might be, to give my complete attention to one parish. Of course, I am still available to help out at the St. Patrick whenever Father Merold needs me.

I would like to take a moment to thank both Fathers Merold and Stenm for allowing me the opportunity to minister at these parishes as a priest. I thank the staffs for their support and patience in dealing with the unusual situation of a split associate. Thanks also to all of you that have encouraged me in my ministry; it has been an honor to be your priest. Although its been a very challenging year, I wouldn’t trade it for anything!

I ask you to please keep me in your prayers as I continue to navigate the intricacies of this new vocation. Please pray also for an increase of vocations to the priesthood, so that the next generation of priests will not have to be split between two or more parishes! Know that you are in my prayers as well. I will keep you informed of my timeline as I find out more information.

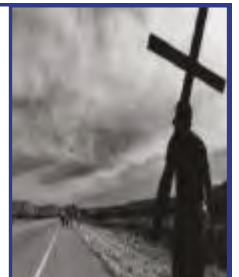
RCIA – Rite Of Christian Initiation For Adults

In the Great Commission of Matthew 28:18-20, Jesus told His Church to go out into the world and make disciples, disciplined followers of Him.

In celebrating this month of Our Lady’s final journey to God in her Glorious Assumption, let us ask her motherly intercession to draw souls to the Sacred Heart of her Son.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a journey too – of conversion to God, and what He intends for us. RCIA is the process where someone is either Not Baptized, Baptized, but hasn’t celebrated Confirmation and Holy Eucharist, or someone who is a Baptized Christian from a Protestant or Evangelical background, becomes a member of the Church, on pilgrimage to our Heavenly Father.

Everyday Stewardship

What else is there to give when one has already given away their body and their life? What more can one say or do to demonstrate love for another when all they have has been given to another? This total giving of self to loved ones cannot be trumped by flowery words, or material gifts that are fleeting. This is the ultimate love. This is the love Jesus had for us on the way to His Passion, at the institution of the Holy Eucharist. This is the love He has for us daily in the celebration of the Mass on altars in every Church, in every city, in every nation on earth. No one can give more. No one can ask for more. This is the true heart of Christian Stewardship.

If you take the time to gaze upon your God in the simplest of forms, and begin to reflect on what has actually taken place with bread and wine becoming the presence of the Divine, then you can begin to understand true humility, sacrifice, and love. And when you have the privilege to take that Real Presence into your body at the meal where you are an honored guest, you become one with the One who is the embodiment of stewardship. Then, you must ask the question of yourself, *"How can I even begin to reflect the love that I have encountered at this feast?"* The answer is you can begin with the simple actions of the day: *where will you go, whom will you meet, and in what work will you partake?* Jesus Christ has shown that the greatest gift ever given can be disguised in this world in a piece of bread. By joining your body to His, He can now transform human hearts, not by grand acts, but by everyday acts, by everyday people practicing Everyday Stewardship.
